

Archives Bouchard, Paris, January 28, 2013:

The bust of Harris Fahnestock, member of the New-York Historical Society, former administrator of the National Bank in New York, was commissioned to Henri Bouchard by his second wife whom Bouchard knew. Georgette Gérard Varet was just married when the bust was made. She was from Burgundy (as the sculptor Bouchard). Her father was a former philosophy professor in Dijon, representative of the Côte d'or from 1906 to 1911 and dean of the Académie in Rennes (Brittany) from 1911 to 1930, whom Bouchard knew well.
